Year in Review

We made significant strides in 2024 towards our mission-driven work to make inclusion happen within communities and across WNY, the Greater Rochester, and the Finger Lakes regions. Expansion of our core service areas resulted in increases in output by a growing staff and volunteer base, and resulted in strengthened community connections. This Year In Review section will highlight some of our successes and illuminate our responsiveness to the needs of the communities we work with.

Year in Review

Inclusion Partnerships

We increased the number of Inclusion Partnerships in 2024 and saw an expansion into Erie and Niagara counties to the west and Wayne, Seneca, and Saratoga counties to the east. In a dramatic, catalyzing development, our efforts led us into a relationship with the NY Power Authority and the NYS Canal Corp to implement the Accessibility Education Program to support businesses to operate inclusively along the Canal communities. Our unique Inclusion Partner services ensure businesses receive training and apply it to assess and evaluate their work, strategize for inclusive programming, and implement their tailored Inclusion Action Plan across all operations.



Increase in Intentional Welcoming

Our mentored inclusion services have resulted in an exponential increase in the number of designated Inclusion Points of Contacts and the addition of accessibility tabs to their websites to provide easier access to information.

Removal of physical barriers

Whether enhancing access to restrooms, adding ramped observation platforms, or creating more accessible wayfinding, our Inclusion Partners now build access into their strategic plans.

Increased invitations to inclusive experiences!

More than EVER before, inclusive choices are now rolling out across NYS, from birding, kayaking, and fencing, to nature exploration, cycling, and artistic expression!

Year in Review

Programmatic Operations



This was a year of growth for RAA. We increased our staff resources and engaged in numerous community planning projects, offered new inclusive opportunities in sports, led a focused effort to connect resources to the community, and provided individualized support and referrals.

Increase in DirectConnect Services

Since formalizing our DirectConnect inquiry process in 2024, we saw a 62% increase over 2023. More community members and professionals now turn to RAA as a first-stop resource for information on accessible and inclusive recreation.

Expansion of Sports Opportunities

In collaboration with USTA and Greater Buffalo Adaptive Sports, RAA introduced [wheelchair tennis](#) to Rochester and also brought in [wheelchair lacrosse](#). Our Inclusion Partner, Ludus Fencing Studio, continues to expand their services and now offers [blind fencing](#). We continued to provide sled hockey and youth wheelchair basketball, as well.

Agritourism and Eclipse Planning

RAA developed an inclusive eclipse programming guide and extended those resources to include general event planning. We were invited to meet with NE Region Agritourism members to consult on accessibility in these spaces which are so often the destination point for field trips and family adventures.

Pickleball & Collaborative Research

RAA collaborated with Nazareth University occupational therapy students and their professor to research the impact of participation in inclusive pickleball on people living with Parkinson's disease.





Year in Review

Our Volunteers

RAA has a strong, and growing, volunteer team which enables us to meet the increased needs. Volunteers supported RAA and our Inclusion Partners, contributing over 1,053 hours of service in 2024. Our volunteers come from many backgrounds, from health care professionals to community members to teenagers who want to contribute to their community. Without our volunteers, RAA would not have been able to reach the 10,560 people we did in 2024.



Increased Volunteers on our Team

We increased our volunteer team size by 24%, including those volunteers who come in for one-time, event-specific assistance. Our volunteers collectively completed 61 hours of training and education to help them be more knowledgeable and effective in their roles.

Increased Community Outreach

Volunteers provided awareness and resources at 17 community outreach events, engaging 3,810 individuals.

Increased Inclusive Opportunities

Volunteers helped RAA support our Inclusion Partners at 11 events and supported another 31 events all of which were designed to introduce people living with disabilities and their friends and families to inclusive recreation.



Year in Review

Our Community Allies

In 2024, Rochester Accessible Adventures significantly advanced its community partnerships. Through strategic and innovative programming and community engagement, RAA has made substantial inroads in fostering disability awareness and education, increasing inclusive recreational opportunities, and ensuring greater access to information by people with disabilities. Our experiential education collaborations with area universities are crucial to training the next generation of professionals!

- Saint John Fisher University sports marketing students collaborated to present the inaugural Pickle, Dink, and Lob social pickleball tournament.
- RAA drove efforts on the local and national Eclipse Stakeholder Taskforce to make the eclipse experience accessible to people with a wide variety of intellectual, developmental, and physical disabilities.
- RAA Executive Director expanded our reach by addressing state and national audiences from public library associations, the National Eclipse Taskforce, and On the Canals forums.
- RAA engaged students and rehab professionals in a variety of experiential learning and research experiences.





Looking Forward

The Tandem Riding Project

RAA has joined forces with Upstate NY Blind Recreation, Erie Canal Boat Company, and R Community Bikes, creating the Tandem Riding Collaborative, which plans to bring descriptive bike riding to people with low vision or who are blind in the summer of 2025.

Roc Inclusive Collective

Expanding our presence and collaboration within the Greater Rochester disability community, RAA will take a lead role in strengthening relationships and working collaboratively with area stakeholders through the Roc Inclusive Collective.



Expanding the Accessibility Education Program

Committing to bringing further accessibility and inclusion for all along one of New York's premier recreational destinations, the Erie Canal, RAA will continue to work with the AEP, providing education, assessment, and mentoring to recreational businesses, organizations, and municipalities.
